Imagine you're on the mountain, alone, white-out conditions, with hurricane force winds, dying slowly from hypothermia, what would you be thinking?

MT. WASHINGTON, NEW HAMPSHIRE — It was truly a "dark and stormy night," perhaps the darkest and stormiest night of my life, for I came to within five key minutes of death... my death... because my rescuers were about to give up! As a veteran pathologist, I had developed a close professional relationship with "death and dying" ...but not with my dying... certainly not with my death!

During the long night, as I lay waiting for rescue in "whiteout" conditions, with wind gusts to 98 miles per hour, and then waiting for my death, I had abundant time to think about living... to think about dying.

It has been said since ancient times that to know how to live, one must first learn how to die.

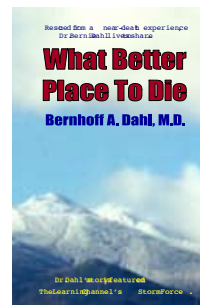
